

Key Points

The focus of our access and participation plan is on improving outcomes for specific groups of students. Data shows that compared to their peers at the University of Worcester, outcomes are lower for certain groups of students

- x Students are less likely to complete their studies if they come from a neighbourhood where not many people participate in higher education
- x The following groups of students are less likely to achieve a degree award of 2:1 or above:
 - o Students from low income backgrounds
 - o Students from an ethnic minority background
- x The same groups of students are less likely to progress to highly skilled employment or further study.

Our data shows that since 2012/13 the achievement of a degree award of 2:1 or above overall progression to employment or further study for students from low income backgrounds and/or from a minority background has improved year on year. However, we believe that there is more that can be done.
